**1. Welcome and Introductions**

**2. GEONEWS**

A. North County Imagery Update – Karl von Schlieder

**3. California State Geographic Information Officer – Michael Byrne**

*OCIO/GIO Background*

The Hoover Commission looked at IT governance and recommended changes, including the creation of the Office of the Chief Information Officer.

*CA GIS Task Force Report*

The Hoover Commission published the CA GIS Task Force Report in July '08 that outlined business processes that are key drivers of GIS. In the report, the Commission recommended the creation of a Geographic Information Office (GIO), established a grant program, created the Strategic Growth Council, and developed integrated outreach programs.

*CalGIS Council Update*

CalGIS currently has a seat vacant on the council

*GIO Future Direction*

There will be a focus on geocoding under the Homeland Security Grant. There will also be a focus on data as a service and 4 workshops are being planned throughout CA to get input from the GIS community.

*Data Strategy*

When the strategy report is available, Michael will notify the Regional Council. The focus for data strategy is to manage addresses.

*ARRA – Broadband*

\$350 million will be available for broadband mapping efforts.

*Future Direction*

Review PPT presentation

*Framework Data*

The GIO is currently in discussions to coordinate at the State level. Michael reviewed four topics: Transportation, Elevation, Hydrography, and Geodetic Control.

*National Issues*

Michael discussed the following topics: transparency in government, Imagery for the Nation, the National Geospatial Advisory Committee, the Congressional Research Service Paper, and the House of National Resources Committee.

**4. USGS Topics – Drew Decker**

Drew gave a PowerPoint presentation. Visit the SDRGC website to view Drew's presentation – <http://www.sdrgc.org/>.

\$14.6 million was allocated for the National Map imagery and elevation data. Some of the products that are coming out of this project will be 1-ft natural color imagery 30 miles in from the US/Mexico border, USACE LiDAR for the coastal areas (500-m for onshore and 1000-m for offshore), 20-cm resolution imagery at 400 m, and 1-m hyperspectral imagery with 36 bands.

Drew also discussed the National Hydrography Dataset and the local stewardship program with SanGIS to maintain and update this dataset. There was some discussion on the process of updating the data through SanGIS. SanGIS maintained that they are not the pro-active manager of all GIS data within the County. Pat Landrum suggested that an online GIS service could streamline the update process. Brad Lind cautioned that you wouldn't want everyone to make changes to the data.

Drew also discussed the beta program of digital quad maps that are available online. USGS is currently in its first stage of the digital quad product. Currently, the maps are available through the USGS store. Each map is 15-20 mb and has no topo or NHD. USGS would like feedback from the user community on this product.

**5. CGIA Update – Mary Cook-Hurley**

**6. SDSU Volunteer Hazard Mapping Corps – Chris Lippitt**

The SDSU Volunteer Hazard Mapping Corps was created to formalize the distribution and collection of data as a result of the 2007 San Diego wildfires. This is a student run organization that participates in OES, FEMA ICS, and WebEOC training. Every fall, they conduct a 3-part workshop. Currently there are 35 geography students registered.

Some potential issues that may arise are exposure to sensitive data during an event, liability issues, continuity, local political concerns, and funding. The VHMC would appreciate any feedback from the user community.
