#### **GEO NEWS**

# **USGS Update** - Drew Decker

- National Hydrography Dataset (NHD)
  - Being updated for a number of hydrologic units across the state
  - NHDPlus high resolution
    - Seamless network of stream reaches, elevation-based catchment areas, flow surfaces, value-added attributes
    - Expected completion for CA is end of 2018
- New digital topo maps for CA for 2018 US Topo
  - Contour lines, hydrography, transportation, background imagery, trails (new this year)
  - Free and available for download by end of year
- NAIP imagery
  - Will be collected by Farm Service Agency for CA this year
  - Four band near infrared, 60cm resolution
  - Previous coverage from 2016 available on <u>Cal-Atlas website</u>, NRCS Data Gateway, and USGS National Map data sites
- How-to videos on using and accessing National Map data
  - Videos listed on website, with more being added
- 3D Elevation Program (3DEP)
  - Plans to release new Broad Agency Announcement soliciting proposals for data development later in 2018, details here
  - Study being conducted on elevation data applications, data products, and benefits, as well as needs for bathymetric data

#### SanGIS Update - Tod Chee

- 6 week transition from Brad's leaving
- Assessor maintained parcels
  - How to absorb data as they deliver it
- Next Gen 911
  - Discussions with Michael Baker
  - 911 compliant roads and address layers
  - Two or three month timeline
  - Will continue supporting existing roads and addressing in the meantime
  - Still accepting address data from jurisdictions

# SANDAG Update - Pat Landrum

- Building outlines
  - Pictometry added about 138 building polygons that were in ROW corrected
  - Should be posted in RDW sometime next week (as of 7/25/18)
  - Just polygons, no attribute info yet
    - Begin attribution process as we move forward
    - Will identify land uses associated with buildings
  - Will be maintained yearly as part of our annual update workflow
  - A formalized system will be developed for working with jurisdictions to get address and other info for building outlines
    - Possibility of an interactive app where jurisdictions could edit or provide feedback
  - Possibility of adding unique ID's for building outlines
- Regional 3D Basemap
  - Using elevation data collected past few years
  - Use new building outlines
- Census
  - Nearly all jurisdictions have completed LUCA process
    - A few cities asked for extensions
    - Good participation from local jurisdictions
    - If you need info on getting reimbursement for this work, contact Darlanne Hoctor-Mulmat at SANDAG
    - Will be reaching out to everyone on PSAP
      - 120 day turnaround
      - Outreach coming in the Fall
- RDW
  - 15,000 registered users now
  - Primary data users are a good mix of industries
- Migration to new server
  - Final rollout in the next 1-2 weeks (as of 7/25/18)
  - Rest endpoint will change (not for RDW)
  - Additional rest services available for most used layers in RDW
- New data layer viewer
  - Geo Boundary Viewer and parcel lookup tool combo
    - Ecology data
    - MSAs, census tracts
    - New imagery (to add oblique later on)
    - Draw and measure tools
- Geocode working group on hold for now, while Next Gen 911 is going on

#### **WORKING GROUP UPDATES**

### CalGIS Update - Ross Martin

- Statewide interest in NENA
  - LUCA May have inspired this
- Speaker from Cal OES
  - Tsunami and earthquake info in an app
- Statewide parcel database
  - Need funds to make this happen
  - This last happened in 2012, data is still out there
- CNDDB California Natural Diversity Database
  - Could be some utility of this database for smaller jurisdictions who can't afford something else
  - Cost is \$600 per year to access the database
  - Affirmative database only: only where research has been performed
  - SanBIOS exists for SD; serves same purpose
  - Building a portal for CNDDB for online access
- Another OES spokesperson
  - Open data hub for fire awareness looking at AGOL
  - Assessing fire damage
- NHD dataset updates
  - Cartographic products to come out of NHD for mapping
  - Plans to build rivers as a cartographic product
  - Full day workshop using Pro at CalGIS conference

#### GIS Manager's Working Group - Eric Culp

- Meeting held on May 8th
- Abe Coughlin from the City of Escondido presented on his experiences installing/configuring ArcGIS Enterprise 10.6
- Round table discussion: Third Party Application Integration with GIS
  - City Works, Lucity, meter reading, FME, modeling, etc.
- Future topics:
  - ArcGIS Pro
  - On-Premise vs. Cloud
  - FME (Quince @ Helix)
  - Eric will send out an agenda, tentative meeting date for August

### 2019/2020 REGIONAL IMAGERY CONSORTIUM

Ross Martin, County of San Diego

- Discussion/Question: is the consortium of value to everyone?
  - Imperial Beach, Padre Dam, City of Oceanside, SDSU all in favor (among others)
    - For a small city (like Imperial Beach), trying to purchase imagery alone would be much more difficult
  - The costs have come down significantly in the past few years
  - Other vendors took up to a year to get a deliverable, not reliable quality
    - Quality control is one of the value-added benefits of the consortium
  - Small company perspective
    - Liked being able to view past imagery
    - Accuracy is great, even if not as high res as other products (NearMap)
  - Switching from USGS because they're not really an imagery business anymore
    - Communication issues, QA QC all internal
  - The consortium allows participants to choose from a buffet of imagery options (subscriptions)
  - Some prefer deliverables versus a subscription
    - Oceanside likes to have physical imagery files on their own server
  - Contractor perspective (Evari GIS)
    - Trickle down to be able to gain access to imagery
    - Subscription based imagery may not always be accessible for contractors
  - SDUSD
    - Both online viewer and deliverables are useful
  - Benefit of custom flights is that we can share imagery with the public
  - SDSU perspective
    - When you purchase imagery as a region/consortium, everyone has access
    - Ability to customize projections
    - Anyone can use; even orgs with no money to spend like SDSU
    - Ability to receive accurate and reliable imagery is appreciated
    - Product is consistent across the region
  - Level of paperwork is minimal because the consortium leaders take care of that
    - Less bureaucracy in getting the products
- Getting requests for next LiDAR acquisition
  - Should think about next process for updating elevation data West to East
- We need a new champion now that Brad has retired in order to handle the leadership duties for the consortium
