GEO NEWS

USGS Update – Drew Decker

- National Hydrography Dataset (NHD)
 - Has been updated for various hydrologic units across California
 - California Department of Water Resources (DWR) is coordinating the work and is the CA NHD Steward
 - New “Markup Application” introduced to assist users in easily suggesting updates or fixes to NHD content
 - More details available at top of NHD Tools page [here](#), including a link to an instructional video for the app
 - Users can suggest changes and DWR will review them and make the actual edits
 - Users will need a gmail account to utilize this app
- New digital topographic maps for California – US Topo
 - Third cycle of maps after editions in 2012 and 2015
 - Multiple data layers included such as contour lines, hydrography, transportation, and background aerial imagery
 - Assembled in late 2018 and now available for download as Geospatial PDF documents via [USGS National Map Download](#) and [USGS Store](#)
- NAIP imagery
 - Was collected by Farm Service Agency for CA in late summer 2018
 - Four band near infrared, 60cm spatial resolution
 - Data should be available in early 2019 from NRCS Data Gateway site
 - Previous coverage from 2016 available from NRCS Data Gateway and USGS National Map data sites
- USGS producing new how-to videos on using and accessing National Map data
 - Lessons vary in length and will focus on a certain dataset or website application
 - Videos are listed [here](#), more are being added
- 3D Elevation Program (3DEP)
 - Continues to support new high-resolution elevation data development nationwide
 - Plans to release new Broad Agency Announcement soliciting proposals for data development later in 2018, details [here](#)
 - Study being conducted on elevation data applications, data products, and benefits, as well as needs for bathymetric data including inland, nearshore, and offshore data

SanGIS Update – Tod Chee

- Next Gen 911/NENA Compliance
 - Contract with Michael Baker International coming to close
 - Provided SanGIS with recommended steps toward compliance
 - Plan is to provide two Road layers, one legacy and one compliant
- Address Point Correction
 - Contracted with City of San Diego Fire and Rescue
 - Hiring staff to manually adjust remaining address point locations, currently being on-boarded
 - Looking to consolidate data with other municipalities to create a regional layer for the RDW
- City of San Diego Public Utilities Department
 - SanGIS will be assisting the City of San Diego with a labor intensive project digitizing and attributing utility layers
 - Need additional interns to help work on this through 2020; will be sending internship announcements to local colleges
 - If you know anyone or have recommendations, let Tod know
- City of San Diego LiDAR
 - City of SD is interested in pursuing LiDAR this year, independently of the Imagery Consortium
 - Any groups or municipalities interested in purchasing LiDAR should contact Scott Daeschner

SANDAG Update – Pat Landrum

- SANDAG hired Hasan Ikhata as new Executive Director
 - Mr. Ikhata is the former director of Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG)
 - Brings new vision to the agency; airport hub/connectivity project a key priority
 - Keen on moving forward with big data & analytics initiatives
- Building outlines
 - Actively integrating building outlines with land-use dataset
 - ESRI developed toolset
 - Staff are fine tuning the details and working with ESRI
 - SANDAG will be executing a task order with consultant to update building outlines
 - Will incorporate new buildings data into the land inventory system and integrate with employment data
- Regional Bike Map data update
 - Hard copy map will not be updated this year, but interactive online map will be refreshed with new data
 - Outreach to jurisdictions in early 2019 for bike data edits and updates
 - Goal is to update the online map by Bike Month in May

RISK ASSESSMENT OF DATA IN ENTERPRISE GIS OPERATIONS - RADEGO

County of San Diego GIS

- Questions:
 - Can use this assessment as leverage to get funding?
 - Yes – that is exactly the utility for this
 - Program piloted at County until it is more refined
 - How did you decide which layers to include?
 - County assessed everything that they're responsible for on SanGIS list
 - How do you assess for accuracy? Where do you start?
 - Start with most problematic datasets first
 - Test for statistical significance
 - What is the score for the trails layer?
 - Not at a point to be able to publish scores for layers yet
 - Is the next step to develop some type of dashboard for this effort?
 - First step was to get this process set up and working; would be ideal to make it a useful tool for others at some point

2019/2020 REGIONAL IMAGERY CONSORTIUM

Tod Chee, SanGIS and Ross Martin, County of San Diego

- Still considering heading toward subscription based service
- Starting to put together quotes (assuming similar business requirements)
 - Need to determine how SanGIS will manage a regional pricing model for municipalities that wish to buy in
 - Goal is to operationalize the expense and enable ability to budget for these services
- Still working with vendors to determine best delivery method for subscription service
- The more customization we need from a service, the longer it will take

- Some internal discussions need to be had before moving forward
- Next steps are to put together package quotes and product availability
 - Goal is to have quotes available for the group by April 2019 SDRGC meeting and get feedback

ARCGIS PRO: MIGRATION, SUCCESSES, AND LESSONS LEARNED

Scott Rothberg, San Elijo Lagoon Conservancy

- Not a lot of people are using Pro in this group yet
- Old versus new layout
 - Darts theme very helpful
 - People get confused by new capabilities and have trouble adjusting
- View based tabs and toolbars
 - Adjusting to toolbar capabilities
 - Managing labels and symbology much better in Pro but learning curve is higher
 - Communication across organizations is important to understand how everyone is doing their workflows in Pro
- Accessing the Portal
 - Another step that was introduced, is helpful
- ArcCatalog is still a mainstay
 - Hardest product to let go of until transition is complete
- Sharing maps and data
 - A major weakness in transitioning to Pro
 - Restrictions on sharing capabilities between Pro and ArcMap
 - Best solution is to export info to a web map
- Educating your personnel
 - Resistance to change coming from employees
 - Encourage people to use ESRI's online education tools
 - Managers should lead efforts to educate staff
- Questions:
 - Recommend starting over with new folder for existing projects?
 - Set paths in existing MXDs to new clean files
 - Import map in Pro
 - Be mindful of multiple data frames importing as individual maps
 - What was your approach for educating personnel?
 - Self educating, and then teaching others
 - Attending UC sessions and encouraging staff to attend
 - Encouraging use of ESRI online trainings
 - Taking charge of training and educating
 - Are we still thinking about having a regional Pro training?
 - ESRI will follow up and take action
 - Some have already hosted their own workshops
 - Traveling roadshow for Pro - get info from ESRI

- Challenge with not being able to publish to servers directly from Pro - will this be addressed by ESRI?
 - Something to consider before jumping into a transition to Pro

 - Will be available for download on SanGIS site soon
